# 1850 - 1919

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- 1846 Bucknell University was founded as the University at Lewisburg.
- 1853 What is believed to be the first object, the Loving cup (number 1 below), was donated to the University, beginning the University's permanent collection.

#### DID YOU KNOW...

- The numbers listed as a part of the artwork's information is called the accession number. The first portion of the number is the year in which the object was formally added to the collection.
- Samuel Bell Waugh, the artist of object number 4, was a nineteenthcentury portrait painter, and is perhaps best known for painting portraits of Abraham Lincoln and Ulysses S. Grant, among others.

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1924 - The Zoology collection, which started in the late nineteenth century, was relocated from Carnegie Library to the Biology building



#### DID YOU KNOW...

- ▶ Eliza J. Martin, donor of objects 4 and 5, was the University's first fulltime librarian, a responsibility that had previously been managed by professors with full teaching loads.
- Lloyd Mifflin, the artist of number 3 on the list, studied with famed artist Thomas Moran of the Hudson River School, known for large paintings of grand vistas in the American landscape.

1932 - Old Main, the building in which much of the University's collection was held, burned down. The fire destroyed nearly all of the holdings inside and their associated records. Artifacts stored in other locations, like Carnegie library and the Biology building, remained safe.

1942 - Pennsylvania State Senator Andrew J. Sordoni donated his collection of Japanese artifacts, including inro, netsuke, tsuba, fuchi kashira, and swords. Sordoni was a graduate of Bucknell Junior College in Wilkes-Barre, PA, which became an independent institution in 1947 and is now known as Wilkes University.

### DID YOU KNOW...

Painting number 8 was initially attributed to Frederic Edwin Church, a Hudson River Valley painter known for his large paintings of dramatic American landscapes. It was sent to be studied at Olana Historic Site, Church's former home and now a museum and interpretive center about the artist's life and work. Scholars there disagreed with the attribution, arguing the style was amateurish and the deer painted clumsily. The actual artist of the work is unknown.

- 1. S.S. Bucknell Victory life preserver The S.S. Bucknell Victory, built during World War II, was of approximately 400 merchant class ships named for colleges and universities.
- 2. Hammered shell art Decorated French artillery shell. Gift of Harry Thomas, Class of 1921 and a veteran of World War I.

#### 3. University Farm milk can

In 1920, the University purchased 170 acres allowing the campus to expand, among other uses a portion of the purchased land was rented for active farming with Bucknell eventually running a dairy farm to provide milk to the dining halls.

### 4. Maung Shaw Loo (2 carte de visite photographs)

Maung Shaw Loo came to the United States in 1858 to study at the University at Lewisburg. A native of Burma, now named Myanmar, Maung Shaw Loo is the University's first international student.

After graduating from the University at Lewisburg in 1864, Maung Shaw Loo attended the Cleveland College of Medicine and returned to Burma as the personal physician of the King of Burma.

#### 5. Croix de Guerre citation awarded to Section 22/524 of the United States Army Ambulance Service (U.S.A.A.S.)

In June 1917, Bucknell sent two ambulance corps units to France: Sections 524 and 525. In 1918, the French recognized Section 525's heroism by bestowing the Croix de Guerre citation on Section 525 unit and its members.

- 6. Section 524 United States Army Ambulance Service, Bucknell Unit
- 7. Chronoscope, (circa 1870) A device used for measuring short time intervals, this chronoscope was used by Bucknell University psychology professor Philip Harriman in the University's first psychology lab.
- 8. Burma Bucknell bowl Burmese ambassador U Win presented the Burma-Bucknell bowl to Bucknell President Merle Odgers on March 1, 1958 at the Tenth Anniversary Burma-Bucknell Weekend to recognize the strong bond shared between Bucknell University and Burma (now called Myanmar).
- 9. Voltmeter (circa 1880-1890) A device used for measuring electricity, this voltmeter was used by Professor Philip Harriman in the University's first psychology lab.
- 10. Microscope belonging to Nelson

  F. Davis, professor of biology at
  Bucknell from 1895 1939
  Professor Davis graduated with the
  Bucknell University class of 1895 and
  received his master of science degree
  in 1896 and a doctor of science "pro
  merit" in 1903 from the University.
  Davis became an instructor of biology
  in 1898 and was the curator of the
  University's museum.
